DRESS CODE:

While at camp, we ask students and adults:

- Wear modest shorts (when hands are extended to the back or the front, finger tips must touch fabric). Sleeveless shirts and tank tops are allowed during day-time activities. Shirts with spaghetti straps, open backs, or excessive armpit cutouts which expose torso and undergarments, or that show midriff are NOT allowed. Large t-shirts that cover shorts should not be worn.
- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes while at recreation and track times (Centrifuge) and on ministry sites (MFuge) and during Mega Relay.
- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt, if participating in water activities.
- Wear modest shorts, pants, jeans, or dresses for worship. Dresses with spaghetti or small straps, open backs, and excessively short lengths are unacceptable (when hands are extended to the back or the front, finger tips must touch fabric). Modest sleeveless tops are allowed in worship.
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.) or wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom.

MFuge Participants:

- Those doing Painting, Construction, and Yardwork (PCY) may be asked to wear long pants while working at certain ministry sites.

Make sure your students do NOT pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person.
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations.
- Has spaghetti/small straps/open back or excessive armpit cutouts, except for sleepwear.
- Is excessively short or tight fitting.

NOTE: Adult leaders have the responsibility of modeling and monitoring their group to ensure students are dressing appropriately.



WHAT TO PACK

- Linens, towels, pillows, blankets
- Water bottle you can refill and carry with you
- Closed-toe, closed-heel shoes (for outdoor activities)
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as toothbrush and shampoo
- Sun protection
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)
- Summer clothing (see dress code)
- Your favorite Neon attire for Mega Relay

WHAT NOT TO PACK

- Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon
- Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, shaving cream, silly string

NOTE: Pranks are not allowed at camp. Your church will be charged for any damages or issues related to clean up.

- iPads, iPods, gaming devices, roller blades or skateboards

NOTE: If students bring cell phones or other electronics, they are not to be out and in use during programming elements: Morning Celebrating, Bible Study, Worship, Night Life, Recreation, and Track Times/Ministry Tracks.



CAMP RULES

Please share these rules with your child:

At FUGE Camps, we seek to provide the safest environment possible for camp. In order to make that happen, we require strict adherence to all camp rules and policies. Our camp rules are outlined below.

INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR

Please note that we take inappropriate behavior seriously. Such activity includes but is not limited to hazing, bullying, aggressive behaviors, and actions deemed sexual harassment or sexual in nature. Some activities that were once thought to be practical jokes may now be considered abuse. Some examples include swirlies, pantsing someone, dog piling, and noogies, just to name a few. Adults and campers should refrain from using any part of their body or an object toward another camper as a prank, sexual advance, or bullying tactic. These actions can lead to hurt and trauma for the victim, as well as legal action. Often these situations happen during free time in the afternoon and after curfew while in the housing areas. Students must be supervised by adults during free time and when in housing areas. If an adult hears commotion coming from a room in the housing area, they need to investigate. Some things start out innocently but can turn to inappropriate activity quickly. Please do all you can to avoid such activities.

CELL PHONES

- The decision of cell phone usage at camp is in the hands of the Group Leader of each church.
- Throughout the week, some elements may allow students and adults to join in via social media (i.e., Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, etc.) However, these opportunities are optional and will not limit the camp experience for those who do not participate.
- Unless instructed by staff, students with cell phones are not allowed to have them out or in use during programming elements: Morning Celebration, Bible Study, Worship, Night Life, Recreation and Track Times/Ministry Tracks. Ringers should be turned to silent or vibrate.

ACTIVITIES

- Participate in all activities and be on time.
- Drink plenty of water and eat three meals a day.
- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes to recreation and ministry sites.
- Wear your nametag at all times.
- Name calling, fighting, bullying, arguing, profanity or any other aggressive behaviors are strictly prohibited at camp. Play safely and use good sportsmanship.
- Always have a buddy. Don't go it alone.



HOUSING

- Be in your room by 11:00 PM with lights out no later than 11:30 PM.
- No guys in girls' rooms or hallways and no girls in guys' rooms or hallways.
- No public displays of affection.
- No practical jokes, hazing, bullying, aggressive behaviors, and actions deemed sexual harassment or sexual in nature in housing areas.
- Housing areas should be kept clean, in order, and free from damage. Churches will be responsible for any damage to the room.
- Valuables such as money, jewelry and phones should be properly safeguarded.
- All campers are expected to respect the rights and property of others. Loud noise and similar intrusive behaviors are prohibited.
- Athletic activities such as running, playing and throwing are prohibited in housing areas. These and similar activities are to be done outside.

WORSHIP

- No gum, food, or drinks allowed in the worship center.
- No video and flash photography are allowed in the worship center before or during the worship service.
- If campers must leave to go to the restroom, they should have an adult sponsor escort them. Make sure students go to the restroom before they go to worship.

GENERAL

- The possession or use of any tobacco or vape products, alcoholic beverages, illegal substances or related paraphernalia is prohibited.
- The possession of a weapon (including a knife and a gun, even with a concealed permit) is prohibited, as is making a threat involving a weapon.
- Exhibiting any dangerous behavior that could endanger the health and safety to self or others is not allowed.
- Use of language that is hate oriented, threatening or race related is not tolerated.
- Theft or willful destruction of property of camp or another person is prohibited.
- Acts of disrespect to staff, adults at camp, or campers in action or language is not allowed.

THEME/BIBLE STUDY OVERVIEW

Revival Generation

What will your generation be remembered for?

And my people, who bear my name, humble themselves, pray and seek my face, and turn from their evil ways, then I will hear from heaven, forgive their sin, and heal their land. 2 Chronicles 7:14

Many times throughout history, we have seen the people of God rise up and turn back to Him with passion and fervor for their faith in times of great revival. What is revival? It isn't goosebumps or an emotional high. Revival is the spiritual awakening of God's people to their true nature and purpose. Revival is mainly for God's people, but those who do not know Christ also benefit because Christians actually get serious about their faith. Has the time come for another great revival? Will your generation lead the way? Join us for FUGE Camps 2024 as we look at four stories in the Bible of great change and revival that resulted in generational impact and be challenged to make a difference for generations to come.



Day 1 - Where does it Begin?

Pray and Turn to the Lord - Hannah and Samuel

Scripture: 1 Samuel 1:9-20, 26-28 and 1 Samuel 7:2-14

Key Verse: This is the confidence we have before him: If we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. 1 John 5:14

Life Questions: Is prayer an active part of your life? What can you do to spend more time with God?

Samuel, a prophet in Israel, ushered in a time of revival for the Israelites by calling the people to repentance and to turn away from their false gods and to turn to and worship only God. Samuel, whose life was the result of the prayer of his mother, Hannah, called out to God in prayer and offered a sacrifice. The obedience to Samuel's call to repentance led to the end of Philistine domination and a reclaiming of land and towns. It also signaled a time where the people served and worshiped only God.

Day 2 - What does it Take?

Confess and Repent of Your Sins - John the Baptist

Scripture: Luke 1:57-66, Luke 3:1-22

Key Verse: Therefore repent and turn back, so that your sins may be wiped out. Acts 3:19

Life Questions: What sins do you need to admit and turn away from?

After 400 years of silence from God with no divine revelations or prophets, John the Baptist initiated a time of revival as the forerunner of Christ, one who would prepare the way to the Messiah. His preaching was bold and uncompromising with a focus on repentance. He always pointed people to Jesus.

Day 3 - What does it Lead To?

Obedience and Worship the Lord - Hezekiah

Scripture: 2 Chronicles 29:1-11, 27-30; 2 Chronicles 30:1-9, 26-27

Key Verse: Let everything that breathes praise the Lord. Hallelujah! Psalm 150:6

Life Questions: In what area do you need to obey God's leading? Is your life one of worship to the Lord?



After years under the leadership of ‘bad’ kings, the Israelites, under King Hezekiah, experienced a time of revival. Hezekiah removed pagan objects of worship from the temple and reinstated temple worship of God only. Under Hezekiah’s leadership, the people purified the streets of Jerusalem of pagan altars. And, he brought back the Passover celebration.

Day 4 - What Will You Do With It?

Heed the Call and Share Your Passion - Phillip

Scripture: Acts 6:2-7; 8:4-8, 26-40

Key Verse: Do not lack diligence in zeal; be fervent in the Spirit, serve the Lord. Romans 12:11

Life Question: Are you passionate in your faith and pursuit of the Lord? Do you have a sense of urgency in sharing Jesus with others?

Phillip was a follower of Christ who became one of the seven chosen to serve and assist the twelve disciples. He was a man full of wisdom and the Holy Spirit. He heard and heeded the call of the Lord to share with the Samaritans, which was the beginning of a revival in the church, bringing peace, strength, and an increase in the Kingdom.
